The Chairman's view.....

Another key member of the Council who is standing down after many years of service to the club is Chris Davis. Chris has spent countless hours sorting out our internal competitions, doing all the photo copying, producing certificates for both our competitions and exhibitions, maintaining the Competition Rules and in his 'spare' time maintaining the club's archive so that we are able to look back through our history. I'm sure that everyone in the club would wish to extend our sincere thanks to Chris for all of his work on our behalf.

The role of Hon. Programme Secretary can at times be a thankless role, as it is hard to cater for all likes or dislikes and the range of experience within a club. That said, it is in my opinion the most important post in the club. Iggy Tavares has managed to produce a varied programme over the last 3 years but his time is also up and he too wishes to stand down. Thankfully next seasons programme is already done as we need to book judges and speakers a year in advance. So if anyone is willing or interested in taking up this post then Iggy has offered to mentor that person towards completing the 2019/20 season's programme. One volunteer urgently needed!

With the programme in mind, it is good to note that interest is being maintained on both annual weekend away(s) and meet-ups/focus groups. Club activities and meet-ups over the past year have included trips to Somerset, The Lake District, Bristol, Littlehampton, Worthing, Richmond Park, South Bank, London Fashion Week and Street Photography, to name but a few.

To give members more time to produce images for the exhibition and to take some pressure off members during the competition season, it has been agreed to hold the exhibition throughout June next year. My thanks also go to those members who gave up their Sunday morning lie-in to help hang the pictures.






PHOTO ENTRY was the new kid on the block this year and it has proved to be very successful. Our thanks once again go to Mike Farley who has not only overseen the introduction of PhotoEntry but has also liaised with the developers of both PhotoEntry and DiCentra (the projection software) to get tweaks and upgrades under way. The trial has been so successful that we are now able to extend the deadline for submitting digital copies of both DPI and Print entries to midnight on the Monday preceding the competition date. Members must remember to upload digital copies of PRINT entries to PhotoEntry. Not only does it give the club a record of entries, but the system actually creates the score sheets on the night. Failure to upload images creates additional work for both the Competition Secretary and the person responsible for uploading the final results.

Still active and a regular attendee at our meetings, Harry had been a member of the group for over 25 years. During this time he was actively involved in the running of the group in many ways, most notably as organiser of its major exhibition at Whiteley's of Bayswater and as auditor. He had also been a member of Croydon Camera Club since the mid-1960s, and was made an honorary life member. More recently he became a member of both the Saffron Walden and Cambridge clubs.

First and foremost, Harry will be remembered as a gentleman, charming and instantly likeable. He was kind, thoughtful, full of energy and enthusiasm, and had a keen sense of humour but always with a serious and considered point of view to express as well.

His own photography was noted for its creativity. He used techniques such as solarisation and multiple images, and experimented with the use of flatbed scanning, to create very personal and thought-provoking images that made for compulsive viewing. He was tireless in his desire to try out new and old processes, in the darkroom and digitally, and never keen to establish a comfort zone for himself.

Most of all, Harry possessed that rare quality of making you feel better for spending time in conversation with him. Arena, along with the other photographic circles that Harry was a part of, will undoubtedly be the poorer without him.








